Elementary Education - Teaching (212) Advising Notes

Liberal Arts Core (*Each course listed is a required major course or a major elective or a pre-requisite to another major course.*): 620:005 will satisfy Category 1A; and 48C:001 satisfies Category 1B. Freshman are strongly recommended to take Liberal Arts Core courses which can also be used for requirements in elementary endorsement minors. See an advisor at the College of Education Advising Center, SEC 189, for specific course selection.

Declaration of Major: A student may indicate their interest in an Elementary Education major any time after their admission to UNI. Formal indication of interest shall be made via the Declaration of Curriculum form at which time the student will be assigned an advisor.

Graduation Requirements: To be recommended for teaching licensure in Iowa, a student who graduates from the UNI Teacher Education Program must have an overall GPA of 2.50 and a cumulative UNI GPA of 2.50, submit fingerprint and waiver cards for mandated background checks, and pass additional exit requirements as noted in the UNI Catalog under www.uni.edu/pubrel/catalog/ugdegreq.shtml#teaching.

Major Course Pre-requisites: A 2.50 grade index in all course work at the University of Northern Iowa, and also a 2.50 GPA in all course work at this university and elsewhere, or the approval of the head of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction is required for registration in major courses in the department.

Elementary Education Majors: must select 240:031 in place of 240:020 in the Professional Education Requirements unless the computer requirement is addressed in a minor subject field or elective course.

Area of Concentration: Students will include either a 24-hour area of concentration or endorsement minor. The student may choose from one of the following areas of concentration or approved university minors: Art, Basic Science, Elementary School Media Specialist, Health Education, History, Literacy Education, Mathematics, Modern Languages (French, German, Portuguese, Russian or Spanish), Physical Education, Social Studies, Special Education, Middle Level Education or Early Childhood Education. In special circumstances a 24-hour emphasis may be approved by the head of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction in an area not listed. The hours required for the concentration or minor are not included in the major hours above. Credit hours will draw from the "University Elective" category in the Credit Summary area above.

Advising: Elementary Education majors should meet with an advisor at the College of Education Advising Center, SEC 189, to review Teacher Education admissions/graduation requirements and policies, to begin educational planning.

Educational Planning: Students should plan their course work so that the following courses are taken concurrently as a professional semester block, prior to student teaching: 210:120 or 210:122; 210:161; 210:164; 230:116 and 800:134. To be eligible for the courses in the Professional Semester block, students must have completed Level II of the Professional Education Requirements, a curriculum course (210:150 or 210:152), and have a cumulative 2.50 GPA. Students should plan their course work so that all Elementary Education courses are taken prior to student teaching. In addition, students must achieve a grade of C (2.00) or higher in the following methods classes in order to student teach: 210:120 or 210:122; 210:161; 210:164; 230:115; 230:116; 800:134. A student must have a cumulative, UNI, and major GPA of 2.50 in order to student teach in this major and should apply to student teach one year in advance.

All Teaching Majors: Students should obtain a current copy of "eCompass" - a guide to teacher education requirements - for a complete listing of Teacher Education Admission requirements. The eCompass can be obtained from the following website: www.uni.edu/teached. A student must meet all Teacher Education admission requirements before registering in Level II Professional Education courses. Students may check their progress in the Teacher Education program through the UNI Teacher Education (UNITED) Student System.
